Scared to Death of Death

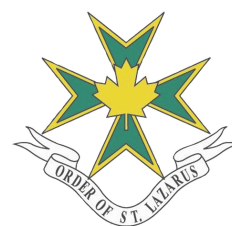

Continued improvements in medical technology tempt us to ignore its limits, create a defiant attitude about death and dying, and suggest a failure when death eventually occurs.
